Certify that the true and Just Amount of Composition for all Tythes whatever  
within the said parish is One Hundred and Eighty pounds Sterling by the year,  
of which sum of One Hundred and Eighty pounds Sterling One Hundred and  
Forty five pounds is due and payable to the Rev. Ralph Dillon and his  
Successors as a Composition of the Tythes Claimable by him as Rector of  
the said parish, and Thirty five pounds Sterling is due and payable  
to the Bishop of the Diocese of Confort and his Successors

And we do further Certify that the average price of Oats being the  
the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years  
ending on the first Day of November One Thousand Eight Hundred  
and Twenty One is <sup>Ten</sup> ~~Eighteen~~ Shillings and ~~two pence~~ ~~for three~~ ~~per barrel~~
