I Simon Armstrong of Moykull in the County of Fermanagh  
Commissioner duly appointed and sworn By virtue of  
an Act passed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> years of the reign  
of his present Majesty King William the fourth  
Entitled An Act to amend three Acts passed  
respectively in the Fourth Fifth and in the  
Seventh and Eighth years of the reign of His late  
Majesty King George the Fourth providing for  
the Establishing of composition for tithes in Ireland  
To ascertain and fix a true and just composition  
for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable  
within the parish of Ennis<sup>St</sup> <sup>S</sup>aint in the Counties of  
Fermanagh and Donegal. Do hereby Certify that  
the true and just amount of composition for all  
tithes whatsoever within the said parish, is five  
Hundred pounds Sterling, which sum of five Hundred  
pounds, is due and payable to the Rev. Hugh  
Hamilton as a composition for the tithes  
Claimed by him, as Rector of said Parish

And I further certify that the average price  
of oats being the corn principally grown in <sup>the</sup> Bounties  
for the period of seven years ending the 25<sup>th</sup> of Oct:  
Inst. is Eight Shillings per Barrel
