

such adjourned Quarter Sessions as aforesaid do ascertain from the said Dublin Gazette that the average price of wheat for the seven years preceding the 3rd day of October 1889 was $18/9\frac{3}{4}$ per barrel of 20 Stone and we do accordingly order and adjudge that the amount of the said composition for Tithes and Tithe Rent charge in lieu thereof in the said Parish of Iveruse in the Division of Rathkeale and County of Limerick aforesaid (other than such Rent charges as became vested in the Commissioners of Church Temporalities in Ireland) shall be diminished in such manner and to such an extent that the amount of such composition for Tithes and Tithe Rent charge in lieu thereof payable for and during the seven years next ensuing the 1st day of November 1889 shall bear the like proportion to the amount of the composition set forth in the said Certificate dated 30th October 1826 in lieu whereof said Tithe Rent charge is payable and to the said Tithe Rent charge as the said sum of eighteen shillings and nine pence three farthings sterling bears to the said sum of £1:18:8 $\frac{1}{2}$ and that the assessment and apportionment of such composition and Tithe Rent charge in lieu thereof shall be

diminished so as to bear the like proportions to the amount of the compositions for tithes and Tithe Rent charge in lieu thereof payable during the seven years next ensuing the first day of November 1889. as the original assessment and apportionment did bear to said original composition in said certificate set forth and we do further order and adjudge that the said Richard Westropp Rev^d John Thomas Waller and Rowland B. Lavenport the applicants do pay the said James Greene Barry his costs and expenses of said arbitration and report and that the said applicants and the person entitled to the Improper Tithe Rent charge in said Parish do respectively abide their own costs of the said application and all proceedings had thereunder.
