for providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in
Ireland, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition
for all Tithes arising growing or payable within the Parish
of Doonagh in the County of Limerick — Do hereby certify, that
the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes
whatsoever within said Parish is Two hundred and Forty pounds
British by the year of which sum of Two hundred and forty pounds
Two thirds are due and payable to Edmond Hunt Esquire
Whose share as Lay Impropriator of his Rpts (his right in
said Tithes being now advertised to be sold by His Majesty's
High Court of Chancery, and the remaining third are due and
payable to the Rev^d. Richard Murray as Vicar of said

Parish, being the Am^t previously attested by him with Parishes
And we do further certify that the average price of Wheat
being the Corn principally grown in such County for the
period of seven years ending the 1st of November 1726 is
£ 1.00.0⁰ per barrel
