I Thomas Gamble Commissioner duly appointed and  
Sworn under and by Virtue of an Act passed in the Second  
and Third Years of the Reign of his Present Majesty King  
William the Fourth Entituled an Act to amend three Acts  
passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, Seventh and Eighth Years  
of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing  
for the Establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to  
make such Composition permanent. To ascertain and fix a  
true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded  
or payable within the Parish of Kilbride in the Diocese of  
Waterford and County of Waterford do hereby Certify that the true  
and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within  
in the said Parish is Seventy four Pounds Sixteen Shillings  
and Three Pence by the Year — which sum is due and payable  
to James Kearney Esq<sup>r</sup> of Gracedew as Sepp<sup>r</sup> of the Economy of  
the Cathedral Church of Waterford being the Average of the  
sums agreed for and paid to the said James Kearney Esq<sup>r</sup> in  
Sepp<sup>r</sup> — for Seven Years preceding the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November  
1830. — And I do further Certify that the Average price of  
Oats being the Corn principally grown in this County for the  
Period of Seven Years ending on the first day of November 1830  
was Twelve Shillings and Eleven Pence per Barrell. Thomas Gamble
