Sir

Your Certificates of the Compositions of the Tithes of Kilcorkrey and Kilbrine Parishes now received and registered here, are I conceive correctly filled. In October 1829, a Certificate was lodged here, wherein the sum of Forty one pounds Sterling is allowed as a Composition for the Vicarage & Tithes of Kilnamanagh Parish, payable to the Rev. Charles Smith as the Vicar thereof.

Robert Young Esq. of Castleera in this County is entitled to a portion of the Rectorial Tithes of that Parish, as is also Lord Lorton, each as Lay Impropriators, but whether the Rectorial Tithes of Kilnamanagh Parish, are to be divided in two equal parts between them, I cannot take upon me to say.

Perhaps Lord Lorton's Agents in Boyle can give you correct information on the subject. Mr. Michl O'Beirne of Frenchpark, who manages Mr. Young's portion of the Tithes can also acquaint you with what part

that gentleman is entitled, I believe it is to the Rectorial Tithes of certain Townlands in the Parish. I have received three pounds, being the fees for Registering the three Certificates, and herewith send you two pounds & change.
