

We Josiah Brampton and Cecil Brampton Commissioners  
duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of  
an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of  
King George the fourth intituled An Act to provide  
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in  
Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a  
true and just Composition for all Tithes arising  
growing yielded or payable within the Parish of  
Kilcoona in the County of Galway do hereby  
certify that the true and just Amount of Compo-  
sition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish  
is Two Hundred and fifteen pounds one shilling and  
six pence halfpenny by the year. of which Sum of  
Two Hundred fifteen pounds one shilling and six  
pence halfpenny, the Sum of One hundred and  
ninety nine pounds ten shillings and six pence  
halfpenny is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup>  
John Meara for the Tithe claimable by him as  
Rector and Vicar of the said Parish, and the  
Sum of Fifteen Pounds and eleven shillings is  
due and payable to John Kirwan Esq<sup>r</sup> as Lay  
Impropriator of the Lands of Linnagh and part  
of the Lands of Ballinduff in the said Parish.

And we do further certify that the average  
Price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown  
in such County, for the Period of seven years  
ending on the first day of November one thousand  
eight hundred and twenty one is Thirty eight  
shillings and eight pence halfpenny per Bushel.

And we do further certify that we have increased  
the Amount of such Composition beyond the average  
Amount of such Tithes during the seven years  
preceeding the first day of November One thousand  
eight hundred twenty one, by adding to the  
said average Amount the Sum of Seven Pounds  
five shillings and three pence, in consequence of  
Losses sustained by Neglect or Mismanagement in  
the year One thousand eight hundred and sixteen.
