Time and under and by virtue of another Act made in the fifth year of the reign
of King George the fourth Chap 63 entitled an Act to amend an Act of the last session
of Parliament for providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland
to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing
yielding or payable within the parish of Kileony in the Diocess of Kilmurrah and
County of Clare. do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition
for all Tithes whatsoever within the Said parish is Twenty pounds Sterling
British by the year and that said Sum of twenty pounds Sterling British
is Due and payable to the Reverend Mark Casady as a Composition for the tithe
claimable by him as Rector and vicar of the Said parish of Kileony and we
do further Certify that the Said Composition do continue unvaried for the term
of Twenty one years from the first Day of November next and we do further Certify
that the average price of oats being the Corn principally grown in Said County
of Clare for the period of Seven years ending on the first of November 1821 is
fifteen Shillings and two pence farthing Sterling per Barrel.
