

and on hearing Mr. A. J. McCoy Sol^r for the applicants and Mr. W. A. Sargent, Counsel, instructed by Mr. J. F. Strange Sol^r for the corporation of Waterford, the Justices presiding at said Court of Quarter Sessions with the Consent of the said applicants and of the Corporation of Waterford appointed William Gilbert of Waterford, accountant, to be arbitrator for ascertaining the average price of the Barrel of Good marketable wheat as advertised in the Dublin Gazette during the seven years preceding said application and it appearing to the Justices presiding at the said Court of Quarter sessions held at Waterford aforesaid on the 18th day of June 1889 by an attested office copy of the certificate of Composition dated the 27th day of November 1833 and the evidence produced before said Justices that the average price of wheat per barrel for the seven years ending on the first day of November 1830 was £1.12.0½ per barrel and that

in consequence thereof the Commissioner appointed pursuant to the statute in such case made and provided had fixed the amount of composition for Tithes in the said Parish of Kilculliheen at £110.0.0 sterling by the year which composition took effect from the 1st day of May 1834 of which said composition £65.0.0 was due and payable by the year to the corporation of Waterford as a composition claimable by them for Rectorial Tithes of said Parish and the sum of £45 was due and payable by the year to The Rev^d Alexander Alcock as vicar of said Parish, And that wheat was the measure of composition for the said Parish, And it further appearing by the Report in writing of the said William Gilbert under his hand delivered to the Justices at said sessions that the average price of good marketable wheat for the last seven years was 19³/₄ Stg. per barrel according to the returns published in the Dublin Gazette And it appearing that the Rent Charge
