

A Valuation made by John Healy of Newmarket and Anthony Colquhoun of Ballyeara in the County of Clare Esquires, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth entitled an act to provide for the establishment of composition for tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising growing or yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilmaleary in said County we find the parish contains in Acres 1498-3-32. The Rev. Thos. McCullagh Vicar of said parish having agreed with the Parishioners at a Vestry held at Millamasulagh Church to receive the sum of £136-10-4 a year in lieu of his proportion of Tithes of said Parish, Mr. Henry Bentley the proctor on the part of the Rev. Standish Grady Rector of said Parish having also agreed with the Parishioners at the same Vestry to receive the sum of £200-0-0 a year in lieu of his proportion of tithes of said Parish. We are of opinion that 2-7 per acre is a fair and reasonable tithe for first quality land in said Parish, 1-9² for second quality, and 1-0² per acre for third quality is a fair and reasonable tithe to pay both Vicar and Rector we give a scale and apportionment as follows dated 15th October 1825
