

We Oliver J. Grace and Arthur Brown Esq^r Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and
by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to
provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time", to ascertain and fix
a term and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish
of St. Ann's in the County of Monaghan. Do hereby Certify that the term and just amount of all
Tithes whatever within the said Parish is one Hundred Pounds by the Year. of which sum of one
Hundred Pounds, one Half or Fifty Pounds is due and payable to the Rev^d Oliver Carey a Composition
for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of the said Parish, and the other half or Fifty Pounds is
payable to the Rev^d Richard Wynne as Curate of the Rectorial Tithes. And We do further
Certify that the average price of oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the
period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 is Ten Shillings and six pence
per bushell.
