I John Payne Morris Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the fourth, entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Composition permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Kilmoganny in the County of Kilkenny do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes that ever within the said Parish is three Hundred Pounds by the Year, which sum of three Hundred Pounds are due and payable to the Reverend Hans Hamilton as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by Him as Rector of the said Parish, And I do further certify that the average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1830 is one Pound twelve Shillings and one halypenny per Bushel—
