

pursuance of a certain Certificate bearing date the 25<sup>th</sup> day of October 1833 whereby the gross amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish was certified to be the annual sum of £210 the said Fitz James Kelly, Horace Stafford O'Brien and Henry V. D'Esteve being such Owners and Occupiers as aforesaid made an application in writing to the Justices of the Peace of the said County at the said Sessions above mentioned to have the average price of wheat being the grain in the said Certificate mentioned for the preceding seven years in the Statutes in that behalf mentioned inquired of and ascertained in order that the said Composition and the Rent Charge in lieu thereof might be varied and diminished according to such average price as compared with the price or sum of £1 12 0<sup>½</sup> per barrel being the price of wheat set forth in said Certificate And Whereas the said Fitz James Kelly, Horace Stafford O'Brien and Henry V. D'Esteve having appeared in respect of their said Application by their Counsel and Solicitor And Whereas

upon hearing Counsel for Henry Wyndham Baron Leconfield the person entitled to the receipt of the Rent Charges and upon reading the said Notice of Application and the said Certificate and it appearing that the said Fitz James Kelly, Horace Stafford O'Brien and Henry V. D'Esteve were three Owners and Occupiers of Lands in the said Parish of Kiltintinan charged each severally with the annual payment of three pounds and upwards in respect of Composition for the payment of Tithes within the said Parish of Kiltintinan and Division and County aforesaid And Whereas the said Justices at the said Sessions (having thought fit so to do) duly nominated and appointed James G. Barry of 90 Great George Street Dimerick to be an Arbitrator for ascertaining the average price of the barrel of good marketable wheat within the said County for the term of seven years then last past. And Whereas the said James G. Barry ascertained from the Dublin Gazette the price of a good barrel of marketable wheat upon the said average of seven years then preceding to be Eighteen Shillings and
