Whereas a Composition for Tithes was made on  
 the 13 Day of December 1833 by William Jones  
 pursuant to an Act passed in the second & third  
 years of the Reign of his late Majesty King  
 William the 4<sup>th</sup> intituled "An Act to amend three  
 Acts passed respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>  
 years of his late Majesty King George the 4<sup>th</sup> in  
 and for the Parish of Killeagh in the Diocese of  
 Cloyne and County of Cork. (whereby the annual  
 Amount for the Tithes of said Parish, was ..  
 ascertained to be a Sum of £974.10.6 payable  
 to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Doctor Rich<sup>d</sup> Henry Rogers as Rector  
 of the said Parish of Killeagh And whereas  
 the said Richard Henry Rogers departed this Life  
 on or about the 1<sup>st</sup> Day of March 1837 and  
 the Respondent thereupon was inducted into the  
 said Rectory of Killeagh, and since that period  
 has been and now is Rector of said Parish

And whereas the said Appellants, appealed from  
 the said Composition and Certificate of said  
 Commissioner, to his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant  
 General and General Governor of Ireland in  
 Council assembled And whereas it was on the 30<sup>th</sup> Day of May  
 1839 ordered by the Lord Lieutenant and privy Council of Ireland that  
 the matter of said Appeal be referred to the then next going Judge of  
 Assize in and for the County of Cork And whereas a Consent was  
 entered into by the Agents for the respective parties to said Appeal,  
 that the annual Amount of the Composition should be reduced from  
 the Sum of £974.10.6 to the Sum of £850 and that the said
