

I James C Lowry Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the Reign of King William the Fourth Intituled "An Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent," To ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Killiam in the County of Wexford Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish taken from the Survey of seven years ending on the first day of November One thousand eight hundred and thirty is Eighty eight Pounds Seven Shillings and five Pence Sterling by the year of which sum Fifty one Pounds One Shilling and one Penny are due and payable to the Rev^d Richard Waddy Esq^r as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish and the sum of seventeen Pounds ten
