duly appointed and sworn, under and by Virtue
of an Act. Made in the fourth year of the reign
of King George the fourth. Entitled "an act to
provide for the establishment of compositions for
tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain
and fix a true and just composition for all
tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable,
within the Parish of Kiltinacody in the County
of Clare, do hereby certify that the true and just
amount of composition for the Rectorial tithes
of said Parish, is one hundred and twelve
Pounds seven Shillings and ten pence by the
year, which is due and payable to the Rev.
Francis Tyrone, as a composition for the tithes
claimable by him as Rector of said Parish -
and we do further certify that the average price
of oats being the corn principally grown in
said County, for the period of seven years, ending
on the first day of November 1821 is 15s 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ per
bushell, as taken from the Dublin Gazette -
