

I John Fenton solicitor Commissioner duly appointed and sworn
under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years
of the Reign of His present Majesty King William the fourth, Entituled
"an Act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and
in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King
George the fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition for
Tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent;"
to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising
growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilnorgan in the
Diocese of Achonry and County of Sligo, do hereby certify that the true
and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said
Parish is Two hundred and thirty seven pounds six shillings and ten
pence by the year, of which sum of Two hundred and thirty seven
pounds six shillings and ten pence, the sum of one hundred and
twenty seven pounds six shillings and ten pence, are due and payable
to the Reverend John Garrett as a composition for the tithe claimable
by him as Vicar for the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish — and that the
sum of one hundred and ten pounds Sterling is due and payable to
Robert Keeler Esq: for the Rectorial or say Impropriate Tithes, as the
Lipse of said Tithes under the Heirs Assignee or Representatives of the late
Sir Henry Montgomery Bart: deceased —

and I do certify that the average price of oats being the corn
principally grown in the County of Sligo for the period of Seven years
ending on the first day of November One thousand eight hundred and
thirty, is thirteen shillings and three pence three farthings by the barrel.
