do hereby certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said
Parish, is *one Hundred & Fifty Six* Pounds *Eighteen*
Shillings and *Five* Pence by the year, of which
Sum of *one Hundred & Fifty Six* Pounds *Eighteen* Shillings
and *Five* Pence, are due and payable to the
following persons, as a Composition for the Tithe
claimable by them, viz:—

Oats being the Corn principally grown
in such county, for the period of seven years, ending
on the *fourth* day of *November* 1830 is *12* *11* *11*
shillings per barrel. as extracted from the *Dublin Gazette*
