

A True Note & Survey exhibited at the Triennial Visitation of His Grace Charles Lord Archbishop of Cashel on the 11th of June 1805.

The Parishes of Kiltinaneha or Doonagh & Union of Killogeunedy are situated in the Barony of Tulla & County of Clare. The Parish of Doonagh is bounded on the East and South by the River Shannon on the West with the Parish of Kilgeene in the Diocese of Limerick and a small part of the Union of Killogeunedy, and on the North by the Parish of Killaloe. The Union of Killogeunedy is bounded on the East with the Parish of Killaloe, on the South with Doonagh & Kilgeene, on the West with the Parish of Kilscoil and on the North with that of Pompreeny. The former is a Rectory and Vicarage & has the Rectorial & vicarial Tithes. The latter has the vicarial only. The Parish Church of Doonagh being in Length 49 feet 6 Inches and 23 feet 6 in breadth wants at present some trifling repairs to the gutters which will be shortly completed; the Churchyard is enclosed by a well built Lime and Sand Wall above five feet high; it is 19 perch 15 feet by 6-18. There are three old Churches with certain portions of burial ground to each; the extent of which I have not accurately ascertained. No Globe. Belonging to the Parish Church are three prayer books, a Bible & Missal. No Paten or Chalice, but the want of them is supplied by the Minister at the administration of the Sacrament. Tithes are paid to the Minister of Meadow, Corn, Potatoes, Orcharding, Cows & Sheep. The Incumbent rates the value of this living at £300 p^{ann} out of which he pays Ten pounds Eleven shillings a year quit rent. The repairs of the Church and Churchyard Inclosure are rated on the Parish when necessary, and collected & annually paid by the Church Wardens. The Parish Clerk's Salary is Ten pounds a year; The Schoolmaster & Sexton Two each. The Clerk & Sexton are appointed by the Minister & Parishioners; the Schoolmaster by the Minister solely. The Patronage is in the gift of the Lord Bishop of Killaloe.
