

I, William Glennon, Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the Reign of King William the Fourth, entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishment of compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Sackin, Diocese of Killala in the County of Mayo, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two hundred and twenty Pounds sterling by the year, of which sum of Two hundred and twenty Pounds (£220) one hundred, Two hundred and twentieth parts amounting to the sum of one hundred pounds, is due and payable to the Honorable and very Reverend Dean Gore, as a composition for tithes claimable by him as Rector of said Parish, <sup>(120)</sup>/<sub>(220)</sub> one hundred and twenty, Two hundred and twentieth parts, amounting to the sum of one hundred and twenty Pounds, is due and payable to the Reverend George Birmingham, as Composition for tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish, including the Rectorial tithes of Kellogee, Killojery, Sackinhill, and Connaghra, in lieu of the tithes arising out of the Townlands of Kilmummin and Ballygary in the Parish of Kilmummin, Given under my Hand this 25th day of October 1832 (Twenty three)
