Patrick Sands do swear, that I will faithfully, impartially & honestly, to the best of my Skill & Ability, execute & perform the power and Authorities vested & reposed in me as a Commissioner in the Parish of Maynooth or Larabryan in the Diocese of Dublin & County of Kildare, by virtue of an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of King George the 4<sup>th</sup> entitled An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited Time (18 July 1823) And also by virtue of the Act to amend the same dated (17 June 1824) 5<sup>th</sup> Geo 4<sup>th</sup> — according to the directions of the said Acts & according to Equity & good conscience, and without Favour or Affection, Prejudice or Malice, to any person or persons whomsoever — So help me God. —
