

To all to whom these presents shall come I the
Rev John George Wynne Incumbent of the United Parishes
of Lorum Sliguff and Ballyellen in the County of Carlow
send greeting Whereas Colonel Henry Bruen of
Oak Park in the County of Carlow has truly served me
with a notice in writing in words and figures following.

For Take notice that I being the Chief Landlord or
Lessor seized in fee of the lands of Lorum and ~~St. John's~~
situate in the Parish of Lorum Barony of Idrom East and
County of Carlow measured and bounded as follows viz
on the North by the lands of Ballycormick on the East by
the lands of Strath on the West by the lands of Glenahary
and on the South by the lands of Ballinkillen which
said lands are charged with or may become subject to a
composition for tithes, am desirous of agreeing for and
undertaking the future payment of the composition in
lieu of Vicarial Tithes subject to the abatement or
reduction of £15 per centum on such amount as
provided for by the acts of 2nd and 3rd William the 4th
Cap 119 and 3rd and 4th William the 4th Cap 100 And I
require you to grant me a certificate in writing pursuant
to said acts entitling me to the benefit of such
reduction which I am ready to accept in manner and
form as prescribed in and by the said Statutes
