I John Palmer Howard being duly appointed and sworn Commissioner, under and by virtue of an Act made in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Years of the Reign of King William the 4<sup>th</sup> Chapter 119 - intitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the 4<sup>th</sup> providing for the establishing of Competition of Tithes in Ireland and to make such Competition permanent (16<sup>th</sup> August 1832) to ascertain and fix a true and just Competition for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Grange Monk in the Queens County - Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Competition for all Tithes whatever within said Parish is Fifty five Pounds seven Shillings and eight pence  $\frac{1}{4}$  by the Year - and that one third of that sum amounting to Eighteen Pounds nine Shillings and two pence  $\frac{3}{4}$  - is due and payable to the Rev. John Bagot as a Competition for the Tithes claimed by him as Vicar of said Parish and that the remaining two thirds amounting to Thirty Six Pounds eighteen Shillings and five pence is due and payable to William Cuffe Esq<sup>r</sup> as a Competition for all Tithes claimed by him as Lessee of Mess<sup>rs</sup> Goswain and Lecky -

And I do further Certify the average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of the seven Years ending the 1<sup>st</sup> November 1830 is one Pound twelve Shillings 8<sup>d</sup> British per Aurrell
