

A Duplicate of the Certificate transmitted to the Bishop of Meath

We Thomas Jackson and Henry Owen Commissioners duly appointed  
and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the Fourth  
Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth entitled an Act to  
provide for the Establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland  
for a limited time, to Ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for all Tithes arising growing yieldable or payable  
within the said Parish of Nobber in the County of Meath  
do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition  
for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Two Hundred  
and Eighty Pounds Twelve Shillings and four pence halfpenny  
British Currency which sum is due and payable to David  
Thompson Esq. Agent of William Thompson Esq. Lessee of  
the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> and most Rev<sup>d</sup> Lord Bishop of Meath  
and we do further Certify that the Average price of Oats  
being the Corn principally grown in such County for the  
Period of seven Years ending the first Day of November  
One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty One is fourteen  
Shillings and one halfpenny British Currency
