

We Charles Gerrard and William Shanly Commis-  
sioners, duly appointed and sworn, under  
and by virtue of an Act, passed in the fourth  
year of George the fourth intitled an Act to  
provide for the establishing of Compositions  
for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time,  
to ascertain and fix a true and just Compo-  
-sition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded  
or payable within the Parish of Aughteragh  
in the County of Leitrim do hereby certify  
that the true and just amount of Compo-  
-sition for all Tithes whatever within the said  
Parish is Two Hundred and forty eight pounds  
two Shillings and ten pence halfpenny, by  
the year of which sum two-thirds are due and  
payable to the Lord Bishop of Kilmore,  
as a Composition for Tithes claimable by him  
as Rector of said Parish, and one third is  
due and payable to the Reverend Francis  
Veray as Vicar, and we do further certify  
That the average price of Oats, being the  
comprincipally grown in such County for the  
period of seven years ending the first  
day of November 1830 is  $13/5 \frac{2}{3}$  per Barrel

However it has been the custom in the  
Parish of Aughteragh for the Vicar to  
receive the whole of the Tithes on paying  
the Bishop the sum of ten guineas  
annually in consideration of his two thirds
