

I John Payne Morris Commissioner duly appointed and
Sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the 2^d and 3^d years
of the Reign of King William the fourth entitled an Act to amend
three Acts passed respectively in the 4th and 5th and in the 7th and 8th
years of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing
for the establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make
such Composition permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just
Composition for two thirds of all Tithes arising, growing, yielding
or payable within that portion of the Parish of Coning in the
County of Kilkenny called Knockree and Garrynara, do
hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for
said two thirds whatsoever in that portion of said Parish is Thirty
three Pounds Sixteen Shillings and four Pence Sterling by the year
which sum of Thirty three Pounds Sixteen Shillings and four Pence
is due and payable to the Marquis of Down, as a Composition for
the Tithes claimable by him as Lay Impropriator of that part
of the Parish of Coning, and I do further Certify that the average
price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in said County
for the period of seven years ending the first day of November
1830 is One Pound twelve Shillings and one half penny by the Barrell
