Tythe Composition Certificate

I Owen Thomas Lloyd, having been duly appointed, and sworn a Commissioner, under and by virtue of an Act, made in the Second and Third Years of King William The Fourth, entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively, in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George The Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition for Tythes in Ireland, and to make such Composition permanent, to ascertain and fix, a true and just Composition for all Tythes, arising, growing, yielded or payable within the said Parish of Phillipstown in the County of Louth, Do hereby Certify, That the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tythes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred and Seven Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Five Pence Sterling by the Year; which Sum of One Hundred and Seven Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Five Pence Sterling is due and payable to The Reverend Sir Thomas Forster Barmet as a Composition for all Tythes claimable by him as Rector of said Parish —

And I do further Certify, That the average price of Wheat, being the corn principally grown in said County for the period of Seven Years ending on the Thirtieth day of November One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty, is One Pound Twelve Shillings and One Halfpenny Sterling per Barrel —
