

In the Matter of an Application to vary the  
Tithe Rent Charge of the Parish of Poleroan in  
Diocese of Ossory in the County of Kilkenny.  
Pollzone (138)

Whereas it appearing to the County Court Judge  
Chairman and Justices presiding at the Quarter Sessions  
of the Peace for the County of Kilkenny held at Thomastown  
in the said County on the fifteenth day of October 1889  
that the Earl of Bessborough Robert Dobbyn William  
M<sup>r</sup> Every and Samuel Charles Lucisay Buchanall being  
four Landholders in the Parish of Poleroan in the Diocese  
of Ossory in the County of Kilkenny each of whom is  
respectively liable to and charged with the Annual payment  
of the sum of three pounds or upwards for Rent Charge  
in lieu of composition for Tithes within the said Parish (other  
than Tithe Rent Charge which became vested in the  
Commissioners of Church Temporalities in Ireland under  
or by virtue of the Irish Church Act 1869 or the Acts  
amending the same) caused a notice in writing signed  
by them to be posted on the principal outer doors  
of the Church of such Parish and of every known place  
of worship in such parish on two successive Sundays  
since the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1889 that is to say on Sunday  
the 13<sup>th</sup> day of September 1889 and on Sunday the 22<sup>nd</sup> day  
of September 1889 pursuant to the Statute in that case  
made and provided the last of such Sundays being more  
than eight days previous to the day of holding the Quarter  
Sessions of the Peace held at Thomastown in and for  
the said County of Kilkenny on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of October 1889  
being the then ensuing Quarter Sessions of the County in which  
the said Parish is situate signifying that it was their intention  
to make an application to the Justices of the Peace at such
