Act in the fourth year of the reign of King
George the Fourth - intituled "An Act to provide
for the establishment of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland for a limited time" - to ascertain and
fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes
arising, growing, yielded or payable within the
Parish of Rathmore in the County of Carlow and Diocese
of Loughlin - do hereby Certify that the true and
just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever
within the said Parish comprising the townlands
of Rathdaric Rathmore and part of Biskubstown
is One Hundred and Sixty Pounds British Currency
or £173-6-8 Irish currency by the year - which
sum of One Hundred and Sixty Pounds British
is due and payable to the said John Swill as
Owner of the Rectorial and Vicarial Tithes of
the said Parish - And we do further Certify
that the average price of oats being the Corn
principally grown in the County of Carlow for the
Period of Seven years ending 1st of December
1825 - is fifteen Shillings 2^d 1/2 - per Barrel
