 certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes
 claimable within said Parish ^{exclusive of two thirds of the Tithes of the Ground of Gurthaulfa} is One hundred and Sixty pounds
 Sterling by the year, of which sum Sixty four pounds twelve
 Shillings and four pence are payable by the year for the Impropriate
 Tithes of said Parish ~~of the Tithes of Gurthaulfa which are~~
~~payable to the Proprietor of the said Tithes to George Aris Esq~~
 the Impropriator or to Dr. Dick Fleury his Lessee as per existing
 Lease of said ^{Impropriate} Tithes, and the sum of Ninety five pounds seven
 Shillings and eight pence Sterling are payable by the year to the said
 Dr. Dick Fleury for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said
 Parish, and We further certify that the Average price of Oats being
 the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years
 ending the first day of Novem^r 1821, is fourteen Shillings and one farthing
 per Barrel, Given under our hands this 20th April 1824
