for a limited time," to ascertain and fixe a true
and just composition of ~~small~~ tithes arising growing
yielded or payable within the parish of St Feighans
de Fore in the County of Westmeath, do here by
Certify, that the true and just amount of Composi-
-tion for all tithes whatever within the said parish
is three hundred and ninety pounds by the
year - of which sum of three hundred and ninety
pounds, the whole is due and payable to John Webb
as a composition for the tithe claimable by
him as Lessee of the appropriators of said parish.

And we do further Certify that the average
price of oats, being the com principally grown in such
county for the period of seven years ending on the first
day of November 1821 is fifteen Shillings and two
pence farthing late Irish Currency per Barrel
