

The John Donistone and Dennis Kelly Commissioners
only appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act
made in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth
entituled an Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions
for Tithe in Ireland for a limited time. to ascertain and fix
a true and just composition for all tithes arising growing
yielded or payable within the Parish of St. Johns in the
County of Roscommon. do hereby certify that the true and
just amount of Composition for all Tithe whatsoever within
in the said Parish is one hundred and twenty Pounds British
Currency by the year. of which sum of one hundred and twenty
pounds one half is due and payable to the Rev. Owen Callahan
as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Vicar of
the said Parish. namely the sum of sixty Pounds and the
sum of sixty Pounds being also one half to the Mechanic
Society as a Composition for Tithe claimable by them

And we do further certify that the average price of oats
being the corn principally grown in such County for the
period of seven years ending on the first of Nov. 1821 is
ten shillings and six pence late currency's Barrel.
