

I, *James Berry* having been appointed and sworn a Commissioner (under and by virtue of an Act made the second and third years of the reign of his Majesty, King WILLIAM the FOURTH, to amend and make permanent three Acts made in the 4th, 5th, 7th, and 8th years of his late Majesty, King GEORGE the FOURTH, providing for the establishing of Composition of Tithes in Ireland) to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielding, or payable, within the Parish of *St. Nicholas's* in the County of *Wexford* and in the Diocese of *Ferns*

I do certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes within said Parish is *£66.9.9<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>* sterling, by the year, according to the average of the seven years preceding November, 1830, all due and payable as follows, viz.:—

*The Sum of Twenty Seven Pounds Seven Shillings and Eleven pence Three farthings To The Rev. John Whelley Stokes as a composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Vicar of said Parish. And The Sum of Thirty nine Pounds One Shilling and Nine pence halypenny To The Right Hon. The Earl of Portsmouth as a Composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Lay Impropriator of said Parish*

And I do further certify that the average price of Corn (as taken from the Dublin Gazette) for the seven years preceding November, 1830, is as follow, viz.:—~~Wheat 12s. 11d. sterling, per barrel, being the crops principally grown in this county.~~ Oats 12s. 11d. sterling, per barrel, being the crops principally grown in <sup>said</sup> county.
