

J. Charles Percival having been duly appointed and sworn Commissioner under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third year of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 119. intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively, in the fourth, fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the fourth. providing for the establishing of Compositions of tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent. 16th August 1832. - to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Shanklin in the County of Wicklow, do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish, is Four Hundred and thirty five Pounds by the year, which sum of Four Hundred and thirty five Pounds is due and payable to the Reverend Joseph Chapman as a Composition for the tithes claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish of Shanklin in the Diocese of Leighlin. - And I do further certify that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in such County for the period of the seven years ending the first day of November next is Hundred and thirty, is One Pound twelve Shillings and ten pence halfpenny per Bushel. - Charles Percival
