

Seven pence halfpenny British Currency, being equal in amount to four hundred pounds of the late Irish Currency is due and payable to the Honorable and Very Reverend, Richard Ponsonby, Dean of the Cathedral and Collegiate Church of St. Patrick's, Dublin, and Rector of the said Parish of Tallaght, as aforesaid, as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him, as Rector of the said Parish, to be paid out of all that part of said Parish, where he as such Rector has heretofore received Tithes. —

And two hundred and twenty-one pounds ten shillings and nine pence halfpenny, British Currency, being equal in amount to, two hundred and Forty pounds of the late Irish Currency, is due and payable to the Dean and Chapter of the said Cathedral and Collegiate Church of St. Patrick's, and their Successors as a composition for the Tithes claimable by the said Dean & Chapter in their Corporate Capacity, and their Successors out of all that part of said Parish, demised by them the said Dean and Chapter, on the 14th day of March 1814 to Richard Lett, for the term of Twenty-one years, from the 29th of September then last past.

And

And Eighty-eight pounds, three shillings and one penny, British Currency, being equal in amount to Ninety five pounds, ten shillings, of the late Irish Currency, is due and payable to the Reverend Thomas Goff, as Vicar of the said Parish. —

And, We do further Certify, that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of Seven years, ending on the first of November 1821 is fifteen shillings and two pence farthing per Barrel. —
