

signifying their intent to make application to the Justices of the Peace for the County of Tipperary being the County in which said Parish is situate assembled at the next ensuing general Quarter sessions of the Peace for said County of Tipperary that is to say the general Quarter sessions of the Peace to be held at hereafter in and for said County of Tipperary on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of October 1896 to have the average price of wheat being the corn in the said Certificate of said Nicholas Mansergh mentioned for the 7 years preceding their said application enquired of and ascertained from the Dublin Gazette and in the manner prescribed by the statutes in that case made and provided in order that the said Tithe Composition and the rent charge now payable in lieu thereof in said parish or Towns might be varied and increased or diminished and the apportionment thereof varied and amended for the seven

years ensuing the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1896 in proportion to such average price of wheat when ascertained so far as same remained subject to variation And whereas afterwards in pursuance of said notice the said Henry Langley Deans Walsh Joseph C. Wolsey and Rev. William Randall duly lodged their petition in writing dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of September 1896 setting forth the premises unto the Clerk of the Crown & Peace for the said County of Tipperary and duly made application in writing for the purposes aforesaid to the Justices of the Peace for the said County of Tipperary assembled at these present general Quarter sessions of the Peace at hereafter in and for said County of Tipperary this 8<sup>th</sup> day of October 1896 and the said application having come on for hearing before us said Justices in the presence of Counsel and solicitor for said applicants and of the solr. for John Bagwell the person entitled to  $\frac{2}{3}$  of said rent charge now payable in lieu of such Tithe
