

I John Toulton sole Commissioner duly appointed and  
Sworn, and by virtue of an Act made in the second and  
third years of the Reign of His present Majesty King William the 3<sup>th</sup>  
Entituled "an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the  
fourth fifth and in the Seventh and eighth years of the Reign  
of His late Majesty King George the 3<sup>rd</sup> providing for the establish-  
ing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to make such  
Composition permanent"; to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable  
within the Parish of Tumour, in the Diocese of Achonry and  
County of Sligo, do hereby certify, that the true and just amount  
of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish, is  
Three hundred and sixty three pounds one Shilling and one  
penny Sterling by the year, of which sum of Three hundred  
and Sixty three pounds one Shilling and one penny, The sum  
of Two hundred and three pounds and Eleven Shillings Sterling  
are due and payable to the Reverend John Garrett as a Composition  
for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar for the Vicarial  
Tithes of said Parish. — and that the sum of one hundred  
and Twenty four pounds and five Shillings Sterling is due and  
payable to Robert Baker Esq<sup>r</sup> for the Rectorial or Lay improprie-  
ate Tithes of said Parish, as the Lessee of said Tithes under the Heirs  
Assigns or Representatives of the late Sir Henry Montgomery  
Bart deceased — and that the sum of thirty five pounds  
five Shillings and one penny Sterling, are due and payable to  
The Right Honorable George Earl of Kingston, for Tithes due  
and payable to his Lordship out of the Townlands called the  
Templevanny and Tienmore in said Parish.
