do hereby certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever, within said Parish is Three hundred and seventy four pounds seventeen shillings and eight pence Sterling by the Year, of which Sum of Three hundred and seventeen pounds seventeen shillings and eight pence one half is due and payable to

Walter O'Broin — for Composition claimed by him as Lessee of the Rectorial Tithes, and one half is due and payable to ~~He~~  
Rev John O'Broin as Vicar of the said Parish, and I do further certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of Seven Years, ending on the First day of November, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty, is Two shillings and eleven pence one halfpenny Sterling per Barrel.
