I Samuel Gale Commissioner duly appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an act passed
in the 2nd and 3rd years of the reign of King William
the 4th published an act to amend these acts passed
respectively in the 4th 5th and in the 7th and 8th years
of the reign of his late Majesty King George the 4th
providing for the establishing of compositions for Tithes
in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent,
the assent and for a true and just composition
for all Tithes arising growing yield or payable
within the parish of Brownstown in the County of
Meath do hereby certify that the true and just
composition for all tithes within the Parish is Twenty
Three pounds each sum of Twenty Three pounds
is due and payable to Sir W^m Somerville Bart
as a composition for all Tithes whatever within the
said Parish And I do further certify that
the average price of wheat being the corn principally
grown in such County for the period of seven years
ending on the 1st day of November 1830 is one pound
twelve shillings and ten pence halfpenny per barrel
