

The same, be entitled to receive from his next Successor £667:13:2½ and no more, (being two thirds of the sum so paid by him, or one moiety of the first mentioned sum) and that his Successor having paid the same shall be entitled to receive from his next Successor, one half of the sum so paid by him, or one fourth of the first mentioned sum, that is to say, £333:16:7, and no more, and that all the foregoing sums, after the first, shall be payable to and recoverable by the present Incumbent and his Successors within the times and in the manner appointed in the several laws in that behalf now in force.

It is ^{further} proposed that the difference between the first charge upon the new Union and the sum paid by the present Incumbent to his Predecessor amounting to £981:19:2, be repaid to him by the Incumbents of the Parishes, to which according to the foregoing plan, the several parts of the existing Union are to be united in the proportion of the value of the additions so made to their Parishes respectively.

According to this principle of distributing this portion of the Original charge, it is proposed that the following Parishes be charged with the sums annexed to their names respectively —

It is proposed that the Incumbents of the foregoing Parishes — pay these several sums by four equal payments, the first on or before the 30th day of June 1850, the second on or before the 31st day of December 1850, the third on or before the 30th day of June 1851, and the fourth on or before the 31st day of December 1851, and that the said Incumbents shall have no claim upon their Successors for any sum so paid by them, but that this portion of the Original charge being so paid to the present Incumbent of Branchurch shall cease and be extinguished, ^{that} unless there be any change of Incumbents, in any of the Parishes aforesaid, before the 30th day of June 1851 — the portion of the charge upon that parish which is to be paid next after the change takes place, shall be borne by the Incumbents in the proportion in which the rent charge for the half year is to be divided between them. As to the division of the Patronage it is proposed that after the Order in Council takes effect, the new Union of Branchurch shall be in the gift of the Crown, and that the right of the Crown in the Patronage of the other members of the Union — together with the rights of the Crown in the Patronage of Odogh be transferred to the Bishop of the ~~Diocese~~, and all the Parishes to which these other members are to be united, being in the gift of the Bishop, ~~that~~ the Patronage of all the new Unions shall thenceforth be in him, and it is proposed that the Order in Council embodying the foregoing plan shall come into operation and take effect on the first day of May 1850 —

NOW WE George William Frederick Earl of Clarendon Lord Lieutenant General and General Governor of Ireland with the Assent of the Privy Council, six at least assenting, and two at least of whom are members of the Judicial Bench DO hereby adopt and confirm the said Instrument so altered and recited as aforesaid, so far as the same relates to the division of the said Union of Branchurch and the Settlement and distribution of Patronage therein made, and do hereby order and direct that the said division of the said Union of Branchurch
