"Providing for the Establishing of compositions for Tithes
in Ireland for a limited time," to ascertain and fix
a true and just Composition for a Portion of All
Tithes arising, growing, Yielded, or payable to The
Vicar of Kilcummin within the Parish of Kilcummin
in the County of Kerry, do Certify that the true
and just amount of Composition for such Portion
or one half part of All Tithes whatever within
the said Parish is Two hundred and forty pounds
Sterling by the year, which sum of Two hundred
and forty pounds is due and payable to The Reverend
Arthur Hyde as Composition for the Tithes claimable
by him as Vicar of the said Parish, And we
do further Certify that the average price of Oats
being the Corn principally grown in such County,
for the period of seven years ending on the first
day of November One thousand eight hundred and
twenty one, is fifteen shillings and two pence farthing
per Barrel.
