

We William Burke of Ballydugan and John Aliman of Eyrecourt in the County of Galway Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth, intituled an act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising growing, yielded or payable within the parish of Kilmesnil in the County of Galway, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is, one hundred and two pounds ten shillings sterling by the year, of which sum of one hundred and two pounds ten shillings, Twenty pounds sterling are due and payable to Dennis Brown as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as ^{vicar} ~~rector~~ of said parish and his successors, Thirty pounds sterling are due and payable to Thomas Hawkins as Dean of Clonsfert and his successors, Twenty seven pounds ten shillings sterling are due and payable to Edward Hartigan as prebendary of ^{Droghda} ~~Droghda~~ and his successors, Twenty five pounds sterling are due and payable to the Honourable and Reverend Charles Trench as prebendary of Ballynutter and his successors and we do further certify that the average price of oats, being the corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1821 is ten shillings and six pence by the Barrel Signed Sealed and delivered this twenty fourth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty six —
