Intituled "An act to amend Three Acts passed
"respectively in the Fourth and Fifth, and in the
"Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of His late
"Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the
"Establishing of composition for Tithes in Ireland, and
"to make such composition permanent."

To ascertain and fix a true and Just Composition for all
Tithes arising, growing yielded, or payable, within the
Parish of Kilronan, in the County of Roscommon,
do hereby certify that the true and Just composition
for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two
Hundred & Sixty pounds Shillings and
pence Sterling, by the year, Of which Sum of Two
Hundred & Sixty pounds Shillings and pence,
One half part is due and payable to The Rev^d Charles
Geyman, the Vicar of said Parish; And one half
part is due and payable to William Molloy Esq^r
as owner of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish

And I do further Certify that the average
price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in
such County, for the period of seven years, ending
on the first day of November 1830, is Twelve Shillings
and eleven pence per Barrell;
