

Parish of Kinsaleen

We Jonathan David Clarke of the City of Dublin and Charles Farran of Feltrim Castle in the County of Dublin Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth, entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Kinsaleen in the County of Dublin, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is two hundred and twentyfour pounds and $16 \frac{11}{2}$ by the year of

which sum of two hundred and twentyfour pounds and $16 \frac{11}{2}$ two third parts are ~~due~~ and payable to the Rev. Stewart Legar French as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of the said Parish and one third part is due and payable to him as Lessee of the Very Rev. the Dean & Chapter of Saint Patrick's Cathedral for the Tithes of Drinam Feltrim Rathkille and Malbestown in the said Parish of Kinsaleen. And we do further certify that the average price of wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the 1st day of November 1821 is $\$1 \cdot 18 \cdot 1 \frac{1}{2}$ per barrel. And we do further certify that the above mentioned Composition is to continue for and during the term of ^{seventeen} years from the date hereof without any respect to the average price of Corn pursuant to the establishment of a Special Vestry duty called and held in Drwode on the 1st September 1824
