I the Reverend John Upsher, D.D. Incumbent of the Parish of Auganagh, having received from Mr. John Craig of Ballygordon seized by Deed for ever of all that and those that part of the lands of Ruskey commonly known by the name of Doogans Farm & Peoples Farm or Middle Ruskey situated in the County Donegal, Barony of Raphoe & Parish of Auganagh, a Notice in the words and figures following

Sir, You are hereby required to take Notice that in pursuance of an Act passed in the 2^d & 3^r Years of the reign of his Majesty King William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend those Acts, passed respectively in the 2^d, 5th & in the 7th & 8th Years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition of Tithes in Ireland, and to make such composition permanent I John Craig of Ballygordon being seized by deed for ever of all that and those that part of the lands of Ruskey commonly known by the name of Doogans Farm and Peoples Farm or Middle Ruskey containing 116 acres or thereabouts, bounded on the North by the Lands of Tully, on the South by the Lands of Upper Ruskey, on the East by the lands of Lower Ruskey, and on the west by Glenmanquin, and being situated in the County of Donegal, Barony of Raphoe and Parish of Auganagh, do hereby signify to you my desire to agree for and undertake the payment of such composition as aforesaid for and in respect of said lands and I hereby require you to grant me a certificate in writing conformable to the provisions of said Act declaring one entitled to the benefit of this Notice, and to reserve the other matters on your part required in the said Act, dated this 20th day of February 1833 (signed) John Craig
