

Now I the said John Wpsher in pursuance of said Act of the 2<sup>d</sup> and 3<sup>d</sup> years of his present Majesty King William the Fourth, do hereby declare the said Robert Vincard entitled to the full benefit of the aforesaid Act, as by said Act required. In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and seal this 22<sup>d</sup> day of April, 1833

Sir I am hereby required to take notice that in pursuance of an Act passed in the 9<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>d</sup> years of the reign of his Majesty King William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> and in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent I Robert Vincard of Ballynahy a farm of land containing thirty one acres or thereabouts to be some more or less under John Marshall during the life of John Lecky which farm is part of the lands of Drumcarr situated and being in the parish of Ray and County of Downgal and is bounded on the north by the townland of Drumcarr and on the south east and west by portions of the townland of Drumcarr aforesaid or being however otherwise entitled according to the provisions of his said Act to agree for and undertake the payment of the compositions for tithes lawfully payable for and in respect of the said lands do hereby signify to you my desire to agree for and undertake the payment of such composition as aforesaid for and in respect of the said lands and I hereby require you to grant me a certificate or writing conformable to the provisions of the said Act declaring me entitled to the benefit of this notice and to perform the other matters on your part required by the said Act to be done
