I beg leave to give you notice pursuant to the provisions of the Statute made and passed in the 2<sup>d</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup> years of the Reign of his present Majesty King William the 4<sup>th</sup> entitled an Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the 2<sup>d</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> and in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Composition permanent.

That I am desirous to agree for and undertake as provided by the said Act upon your performing the matters and things prescribed and enacted by the said Act to be done and performed on your part the future payment of the tithes composition issuable and payable out of the Townlands or parts of Townlands and lands as described in the Map or Terra Chart or ground plan enclosed on this Notice first deducting the 15 per Centum on the amount as provided by the said Act and I hereby require you in pursuance of the provisions of said Act to grant to me with all convenient speed a Certificate under your hand and Seal of the Import required by the said Act in order that I may execute under my hand and Seal the declaration of the Import required by the said Act in the manner therein described. And I give you notice that I am the Chief Landlord ~~in~~ in fee simple of the Rent and reversion of the said lands or premises and that I am ready to give you any further information in relation thereto which you may require upon receiving any notice from you for the purpose
