

Charles Percival having been duly appointed and sworn  
Commissioner under and by virtue of an Act made in the second  
and third year of the Reign of His Majesty King William  
the Fourth, Chapter 119 entitled an Act to amend three Acts  
passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and  
eighth year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George  
the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition of  
Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Composition permanent 16<sup>th</sup>  
of August 1832 to ascertain a true and just Composition of  
all such Tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the  
Parish of Lullowren in the County of Carlow, Do hereby Certify  
that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes  
whatsoever within the said Parish of <sup>Lullowren</sup> is Three Hundred and forty two pounds  
by the year, which sum of Three hundred and forty two pounds, is due  
and payable to the Reverend Samuel Downing, as a Composition  
for the Tithes ~~claimed~~ <sup>due</sup> by him as Lessee of said Tithes of said Parish  
of Lullowren in the Diocese of Leighlin, held by and under  
the Lease from the Dean and Chapter of Saint Lazarus  
Leighlin. And I do further Certify that the average  
Price of wheat, being the corn principally grown in such County  
for the period of the seven years ending the first day of  
November eighteen hundred and thirty, is one pound  
twelve shillings and ten pence halppenny In Pound
